In the Classroom

The Sixth grade team will work with students and their families to support students' success in meeting or exceeding the CA Common Core State Standards. Some of our key ways to connect our classroom practices with the school goals will be to:

- Students will revise and edit one writing assignment each week using CUPS and ARMS during Language
- Students will be given 30% of their Math class to independently work on problem solving and computation.
- Students will practice daily independent reading to increase their reading fluency and comprehension.
- Student learning will be supported through the consistent implementation of the 4C's (creativity, critical thinking, collaboration, communication).
- Students will be exposed to a variety of technology skills. (Key boarding, research, power points, etc.).



At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

- Students will read their writing aloud to their parents.
- Parents will use the math materials provided by the teacher to support their child's learning.
- Parents will monitor the students' nightly 20 minutes of reading.
- Parents will monitor TV viewing, video games, tablet use and us of social media.

- Attend ELAC (English Language Acquisition Committee) meetings.
