Summer School begins second session

Several hundred Chino Valley Unified School District students are hitting the books this summer to make up credits, improve grades, take courses they can't

get to during the regular school year, and to boost their school academic experience.

The first session of CVUSD's Summer School program is finishing up this week and a second session will begin Monday and continue through Aug. 4.

Remediation classes have been offered to elementary, junior high and high school students, based on referrals from their home school. Summer enrichment courses are also offered to high school students.

Among the enrichment classes being offered are Integrated Math 2 Honors, Trigonometry/Pre-Calculus Honors, Spanish 2 & 3 Honors, Advanced Placement European History, World Geography, Art Fundamentals, SAT Preparation, Physical Education – Band, Yoga, and Gaming Fundamentals.

Summer School sites are Ayala and Chino Hills high schools for high school students, Ayala High for junior high students, and Walnut Avenue Elementary School for elementary students.

The District has also partnered with Chaffey College and California State University San Bernardino to offer fee-based, online summer school programs to students.
