The California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress begins on Monday, March 20 with our 6th grade students and continue through May 12. All students in grades 3rd-6th will take part in the computerized SBAC for Language Arts and Math. A schedule will be posted on the school website for all grades. Please be sure your child is in attendance each day and on time during testing. Also, be sure to provide a protein for your child for breakfast, recess, and lunch to sustain their energy level for the duration of the day.
