BACK-TO-SCHOOL NIGHT - Parents ONLY!

Please plan on attending our Back-to-School Night on **Tuesday, August 23**. We will have two sessions in order to accommodate families with more than one child: 6:00-6:40pm and 6:50-7:30pm. During this very important meeting, teachers will give an overview of the grade level curriculum that will be



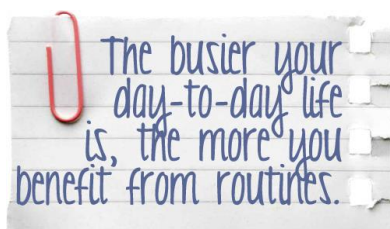
presented during the year and standards that must be met. Teachers will also review classroom rules, behavioral expectations, and homework procedures. Your participation is the beginning of a successful year for your child. We ask that children do not attend in order for you to give your full attention to the presentation. **Parking during Back-to-School Night is limited; we encourage you to walk if at all possible.**

*** TK/K parents will be able to attend either session at 6:00pm or at 6:50pm.**

RETURNING TO SCHOOL

You may have noticed your child is exhausted when s/he comes home from school. Getting back into the routine of school is tough. Here are some suggestions to help get you through the first few weeks:

- Allow your child some down time when they get home from school. Their brains have been stimulated all day; they need an opportunity to relax.
- Keep after school routines as consistent as possible - relax, homework, dinner, shower, reading, bed.
- Keep bedtimes at the same time each night. It is recommended that students in TK-3rd grade head to bed between 8:00-8:30pm. 4th-6th grade students should be right behind them, no later than 9:00pm.
- Establish organization for daily homework and for a place to keep all school information.
- Get ready the night before - lay out clothes, make lunches, get back pack ready.

As a reminder, **there is NO supervision of students prior to 8:30am.** Many students are dropped off in the front of school prior to 8:30am. When students are not supervised, your child's safety is compromised and unfavorable student behavior may arise. We strongly encourage you to wait with your child prior to 8:30am or to make other drop-off arrangements. Howard Cattle now has a before school child care called the Sunrise Program; child care begins at 6:00am. In addition, supervision at the end of the day ends at 3:30pm. Please make the appropriate arrangements to ensure your child is picked up on time every day.

CLOSED CAMPUS

In order to ensure the safety of all students, **Howard Cattle is a closed campus during arrival and dismissal times.** Parents say good-bye to

their children at the gate. Students will enter campus and walk to their class line. You may drop your child off at either the Clover Gate on Clover St. or at the South Gate (gate at the far end of the parking lot between the 5th grade pod and the new building). Both of these gates are accessible from the car lines. TK and Kinder students will be dropped off at the Kinder Gate on Cypress Ave. We request that parents of kinder students park their car and walk their kinder student to the gate. Parents should wait with kinder students until the teacher invites them through the gate.

At dismissal, students will exit either the Clover Gate or the South Gate. TK/K-AM students will exit the Kinder Gate. K-PM will exit at the Cypress Ave gate. If your child is in 1st-3rd grade and attending an after school day care, please inform your child's teacher.

Be sure your child knows where s/he is going to be picked up each day and by whom. Doing so will ease any confusion or unnecessary worry on the child's or the parent's part. We ask that you communicate afterschool arrangements with your child before school. We are unable to accommodate requests to interrupt class to deliver messages regarding after school arrangements.

If you have an appointment with a teacher or you are volunteering, please come in the office to sign in before entering campus.

Following these procedures allows the office to monitor adults on campus which assists office staff in assuring student safety.

We will ask for your patience while waiting for your child to exit the school gates. We ask that you do not crowd the gates in order for all students to enter and exit in a calm manner.

Gates will be open for parent entry for the first two days of school only. We GREATLY appreciate your cooperation implementing this policy.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Attendance patterns are formed early in life. Children who develop good attendance habits in the early grades will be more likely to continue them throughout their school career. This is important, because students who miss school miss out on carefully planned sequences of instruction. They miss active learning experiences and class participation. They miss the opportunity to ask questions. They are more likely to fall behind, and to eventually drop out. In addition, there is no greater disruption to the instructional process for the whole class than students who are frequently absent, late, or pulled out of class early.

Continuing this year, teachers will pick students up at their line at the 8:37am warning bell.

Instruction will begin promptly at 8:40am. Gates will close at 8:40am. **Any student arriving after 8:40am will be marked tardy.** This procedure is to decrease the frequency of tardies at Cattle, to keep instructional time sacred, and to keep the campus safe and secure. Your cooperation in the matter is greatly appreciated.

Your child's attendance directly affects the funding for our school district and our school. Our school community is depending on you to make sure your child is at school every day. Remember: **Attendance Counts! Make illness the only excuse.**

PARKING LOT PROCEDURES

Keep our future safe!! Put down your cell phones, turn your radio down, and follow all parking lot procedures as outlined in the Parent Handbook. Adhering to these procedures and to the directions of supervising adults is imperative and appreciated for the safety of our students. Safety of your child is our #1 concern!

The safety of a child far outweighs the inconvenience to parents!



SCHOOL BREAKFAST

Howard Cattle serves breakfast every morning on campus from 8:00-8:30am. The cost of breakfast is \$1.00 which includes milk, fruit, and a hot/cold breakfast entrée. This is available to all students.

SCHOOL LUNCH

Each child must eat lunch every day whether it is from home or the school cafeteria. Students are provided ample opportunity to eat before playing at recess.

Students can purchase lunch each day for \$2.50. We encourage lunches to be paid for on-line at myschoolbucks.com. There is also an app, making your mobile life that much simpler! Students can also pay for their lunch before school in the main office. If lunch is brought from home, milk may be purchased for \$0.25 and orange juice for \$0.35 at lunch time. A free or reduced priced lunch is available to families who are eligible. Go to www.chino.k12.ca.us for more information.

If a lunch is dropped off late, students are to look on the lunch table in the office. **Classes will not be interrupted to notify a child of a late lunch.**
