Superintendent's Response to DELAC and LCAP Parent Advisory Committee's Comments and Questions

1. Where can I find the results for the California Healthy Kids Survey?

Superintendent's Response: The district level results for the California Healthy Kids Survey is located on the Health Services webpage: https://www.chino.k12.ca.us/Page/51414

2. How many days of Saturday School are offered to help students get on track with their classroom?

Superintendent's Response: The school sites determine how many days are needed for Saturday School by reviewing their attendance rates.

3. For bilingual clerks, is there at least one Spanish speaking office person at each school site?

Superintendent's Response: Bilingual clerks are determined if 15 percent or more of the pupils enrolled in a public school that provides instruction in kindergarten or any of grades 1 to 12, inclusive, speak a single primary language other than English (Ed. Code 48985). Chino Valley Unified School District provides bilingual clerks at 14%.

4. Who at the district level oversees the restorative justice program?

Superintendent's Response: Restorative practices is part of the district's Multi-Tiered Systems of Support for Behavior program through Health Services.

5. Will there be a district-wide college fair in-person next year?

Superintendent's Response: This year, the District had intended to host an in-person event; however, participating universities/colleges committed to a virtual environment. An in-person event is scheduled for the 2022-2023 school year.

6. How did the Dual Language Immersion program happen at Hidden Trails Elementary School? Will other elementary schools teach different language programs?

Superintendent's Response: It was decided to start the Dual Language Immersion program at Hidden Trails Elementary School due to room availability and community interest in a dual language immersion program. A Spanish Dual Language Immersion program is being considered, and the school site is to be determined. Additionally, before and after school language enrichment programs are being researched, as well as building more language programs into the district schools.
